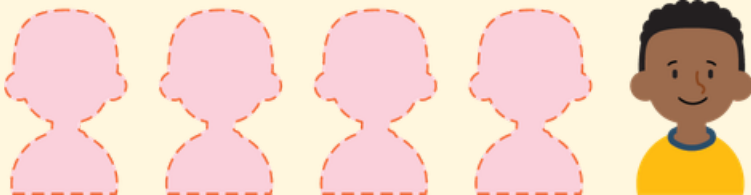

North Carolina demand for OST opportunities

In North Carolina, the demand for afterschool programs is incredibly high. Parents of **over 850,000 children** want afterschool programs, but **nearly 4 in 5 children are missing out.**



Families value and rely on OST programs

88%

of parents agree programs encourage fun and learning and decrease screen time

84%

of parents agree programs boost their kids' employability skills like teamwork, critical thinking, and leadership skills

92%
